MARINE CORPS HISTORY FOR JANUARY

3 January, 1945

VMF-213 and VMF-124, from the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Essex, struck Formosa and the Ryukyu Islands, in the <u>first Marine land</u> strike from a carrier.

6 January, 1859

Brig. Gen. Archibald Henderson died in office, having served thirty-nine years as the fifth Commandant of the Marine Corps.

15 January, 1943

Capt. Joe Foss shot down three Japanese planes, bringing his total to a record of twenty-six kills.

18 January, 1961

Sgt. Major Bertha Peters was the first woman Sgt. Major in the Marine Corps.

24 January, 1968

The 26th Marine Regiment held the Khe Sanh' Combat Base, Vietnam.

28 January, 1942

The 4th Marine Regiment was assigned to support the Philippine Scouts on Bataan.

29 January, 1991

Marines participated in the first major ground action of Operation Desert Storm.

31 January, 1944

The American Flag was first raised on Japanese soil by B-Co., 1st Battalion, 25th Marine Regiment, in the Marshall Islands.


